

OpenPEPPOL Achievements in 2014

During 2014, the OpenPEPPOL Association has successfully expanded its reach, with a growing number of members, service providers and transactions:

- 128 Members
- 86 PEPPOL Access Points established in 17 countries.
- 4 PEPPOL Authorities in: Norway (Difi), Sweden (ESV), Denmark (DIGST), Netherlands (Simplerinvoicing).
- With over 1.000.000 eInvoicing transactions per month, OpenPEPPOL have reached the 2014 CEF Work Programme targets for eDelivery and eInvoicing.

OpenPEPPOL Coordinating Communities

Transport Infrastructure (eDelivery) Community:

- Full scale operation of secure, scalable and cost effective PEPPOL multi-protocol eDelivery.
- Support for DG DIGIT in establishing the CEF eDelivery DSI Core Service Platform, including preparations for transfer of operations of the SML service provision to DG DIGIT
- Supporting Oasis BDXR TC with finalization and approval of OASIS Service Metadata Publishing (SMP) Version 1.0 specification

Post-award Community:

- Upgraded the PEPPOL Business Interoperability Specifications (BIS) to generation 2.0 - based on the CEN WS BII 2 profiles and UBL 2.1 syntax binding.
- Further developed the Governance & Lifecycle Management framework; and established the Post-Award Change Management Board

Pre-award Community:

- Launched the PEPPOL BIS Project to produce implementation guides and specifications for the pre-award procurement phase, based on CEN/BII 3 deliverables and the eSENS eTendering pilot requirements.
- Collaborated with DG MARKT on the integration of business processes between the Virtual Company Dossier and the European Single Procurement Document.

OpenPEPPOL ensured that its communities' requirements would be secured in the formation and provisioning of DSI services in the CEF program.
